

PHOTOS 1 & 2: Typical pioneer Fynbos on former pine tree plantation areas. Note prevalence of grasses and pioneer shrubs like *Passerina*, *Chrysanthemoides*, *Helichrysum* and *Pelargonium*.



PHOTOS 3 & 4: Remnant Forest patches occur on the slopes of small drainage valleys. Forest pioneer species like *Halleria*, *Rhamnus*, *Rhus* and *Trimeria* are typical. With removal of the surrounding pine trees, the forest patches have become exposed and vulnerable.



PHOTOS 5 & 6: Pioneer Thicket/Forest on south-facing slopes within the former pine plantation area. Typical pioneer species are *Halleria*, *Rhus* and *Chrysanthemoides*.



PHOTOS 7 & 8: Typical grassy and weedy cover of the more highly disturbed areas, in this case, along the roads.



PHOTO 9: The minor stream which has become polluted by municipal sewerage discharge has been negatively impacted by the nutrient-rich effluent.



PHOTO 10: Landscape connectivity to the east, through alien invaded and Plantation areas as well as the Groeneweide Forest will not be affected by the proposed development.
