

√ □	Description of impact on heritage resource: According to consulting palaeontologist, John Pether (email correspondence dated 10 June 2020), `The cemetery area is underlain by surficial soil on top of the calcrete capping the Wankoe Formation aeolianites. The Wankoe Fm. is depicted CLEAR/UNKNOWN (desktop PIA required.) on the SAHRIS PalaeoMap. Fossil land snails occur, but fossil bones have not been recorded and are evidently very sparse. Nevertheless, fossil bones could occur, such as in similar aeolian formations. It is rated to be of LOW sensitivity.
	The cemetery area is partly overlapped by colluvium and alluvium (Qg) along the drainage

which is rated LOW.

Fossiliferous, shelly Pliocene marine deposits of the De Hoopvlei Fm. (VERY HIGH) underlie the Wankoe Fm. aeolianites. However, it is unlikely that these deposits will be intersected in typical excavations.

The bedrock is Bokkeveld Group mudstones/shales. Although rated overall VERY HIGH on the SAHRIS PalaeoMap, due to the weathering and deformation in this area, the fossil potential is very limited, i.e. LOW and furthermore it is unlikely that this bedrock will be intersected in typical excavations'.
