RE: PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PLAN FOR THE PROPOSED EXPANSION OF THE EXISTING GOUE AKKER CEMETERY ON THE REMAINDER OF FARM NO. 185, BEAUFORT WEST

- 1. This Directorate's letter dated 8 July 2020, and the amended Public Participation Plan ("PP-plan") (compiled by Sharples Environmental Services cc, Reference: 22/PPPlan/BW Cemetery/06/2020, Dated: July 2020) for the abovementioned proposal have reference.
- 2. This letter serves as an acknowledgment of receipt of the abovementioned document.
- 3. This Directorate reviewed the amended PP-plan and **agrees** to the proposed actions to conduct a public participation process, **subject to the following** being incorporated in the PP-plan / project programme:
 - 3.1. Complying with Regulation 41(2)(b)(ii) of the EIA Regulations, 2014 (as amended)

This Directorate takes note of the proposal to erect notice boards at various points in order to inform adjacent landowners and minimise physical interaction with the community. This Directorate agrees with the proposal and further suggests that notice boards be placed at alternate intersections within a one-kilometre radius of the site.

3.2. Complying with Regulation 41(2)(c)(i) of the EIA Regulations, 2014 (as amended)

According to the amended PP-plan an advertisement will be placed in the Oudtshoorn Courant. Although the Oudtshoorn Courant is distributed within Beaufort West, it may not be the preferred paper by the community in Beaufort West. As such it is advised that consideration be given to one of the local newspapers in Beaufort West (e.g. **Die Courier**) for the placement of the advertisement.

3.3. Site Sensitivity Verification Report

According to the cover letter by your appointed independent Environmental Assessment Practitioner ("EAP"), the site sensitivity verification report will be submitted as part of the Final

Basic Assessment Report ("BAR"). Please note that the outcome of the site sensitivity verification must be recorded in the form of a report that is submitted together with the relevant assessment report prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations, 2014. In this instance the Draft BAR and Final BAR are identified to be relevant reports. The Competent Authority therefore specifies that the site sensitivity verification report <u>must</u> be appended to both the Draft BAR and Final BAR.

With reference to Point 7 of this Directorate's letter dated 8 July 2020 please be advised that the site sensitivity verification report should be submitted to this Directorate prior to the submission of the application for environmental authorisation to the Department. This will enable this Directorate to provide guidance and advice of the nature and extent of any of the processes that may or must be followed or decision support tools that must be used in order to comply with the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations, 2014.

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1. Introduction

Sharples Environmental Services cc (SES) has been appointed by the Aurecon on behalf of the Beaufort West Municipality (the proponent) to apply for Environmental Authorisation for the proposed expansion of the existing "Goue Akker" cemetery on the remainder of Farm Nr.185 in Beaufort West, Western Cape.




Figure 1: Locality of proposed development.

LOCATION DESCRIPTION

The remainder of Farm No. 185 is situated to the south of the Beaufort West town centre, on Blyth Street and outside of the delineated urban edge. The proposed site is classified as a Greenfield site as the proposed site is has not been developed and is fairly undisturbed.

The town of Beaufort West is located within the in the Central Karoo District Municipality and is the largest town in the arid Great Karoo region. Beaufort West is at the centre of an agricultural district based mainly on sheep farming and is a significant town the N1 national road.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED ACTIVITY

The Beaufort West Municipality proposes to expand the existing "Goue Akker" cemetery by approximately 82 569m² to accommodate additional burial spaces for the next decade. The **Site**



Layout Plan is shown in the figure below show that the proposed expansion of the existing cemetery will entail the provision of approximately 7 410 – 10 545 new burial spaces separated into 18 - 26 blocks, depending on layout option, segregated by internal gravel roads. Reworking of the existing access road, as well as in-situ stormwater management is proposed within the internal road network, along with an outer stormwater berm and a detention pond. Furthermore, a caretaker and ablution facility (for equipment storage), as well as a cavcon palisade fence is proposed.




Figure 2: Size of each aspect proposed.

The proposed development will also require an application for General Authorization in terms of Section 39 of the National Water Act, 1998 (Act 36 Of 1998), from the Department of Water and Sanitation, which has been undertaken by Marita Burger of SES, a summary report of the application will be made available with the BAR, as an attachment. Proof of submission of the application to the Department of Water and Sanitation, along with an email clarifying that no public participation is required, from the consultant, has been included in Appendix C and D, respectively.

In the case of the proposed Beaufort West development, the BAR will be allotted a **60 day** review period during the post-application public participation process.

As per Government Notice No. 650 of 5 June 2020. All I&AP's will be notified of the public participation period. In addition, all I&AP's will be advised that should they require additional time



to comment, they may submit this request through to SES within the allotted public participation period, with appropriate motivation, on why they require this extension, and this will be determined by the EAP in consultation with the Department. This will additionally be included in the BID.




Figure 4: Identified neighbouring I&APs



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


Figure 5: Identified neighbouring I&AP's of Farm RE/185 will be in excess of 1000, therefore will not be feasible.
