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### 1. Introduction

Sharples Environmental Services cc (SES) has been appointed by Mr Kaye Smith, of Storage Mossel Bay (Pty) Ltd, to undertake the Basic Environmental Impact Assessment for the Proposed Construction of a Storage Facility on Erf 21275, Mossel Bay Local Municipality.

### LOCATION DESCRIPTION

The proposed site is situated on Erf 21275, located west of Vyf Brakke Fontein located within ward 7 of the Mossel Bay Local Municipality, Garden Route District Municipality. The site does contain some disturbance, including existing infrastructure located on the eastern portion of the site, and informal tracks, leading off of the tarred Nagtegaal Street, which forms the eastern boundary of Erf 21275. The site is located approximately 11.5km's inland, of Mossel Bay, the proposed coordinates are tabled below:

The proposed facility is approximately 28 830m<sup>2</sup> and is located in an ESA1: Aquatic area. According to CapeFarmMapper, 2021, approximately three quarters of the site is considered natural, which is defined as, "areas that are not essential for meeting biodiversity targets, but that play an important role in supporting the functioning of PAs or CBAs and are often vital for delivering ecosystem services". According to the Vegetation Map, 2018, the site is dominated by North Langeberg Sandstone Fynbos, with a threat status of Least Threatened (CapeFarmMapper, 2021).




Figure 2: Biodiversity attributes.

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED ACTIVITY

The proposed development site is situated in Aalwyndal, on Portion 240, Vyf Braakke Fontein Farm, approximately 13km's north west of Mossel Bay Central. The proposed development will entail:

- The construction of 36 000m<sup>2</sup>, storage facility, accommodating approximately 2000 storage units that will be used for the storage of private goods, including but not limited to furniture, caravans, equipment, etc.
  - Unit sizes are proposed to be similar to a normal single garage size.
  - Accommodation will be made for a manager and security office on site, as well as ablution facilities within the building.
- Construction materials include concrete block or brick with corrugated metal roof.




Figure 3: Proposed distribution of onsite-notices and letter-drops.
