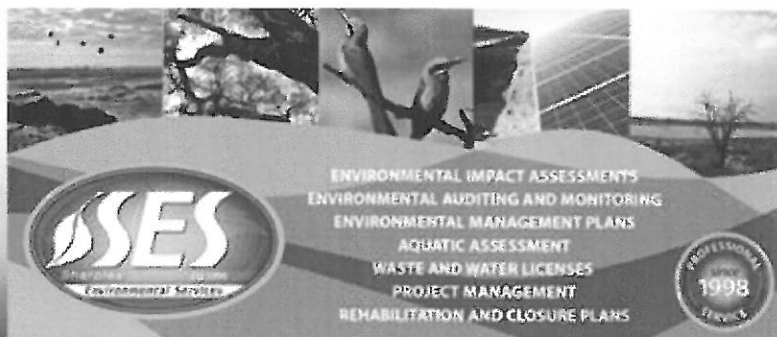

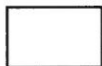
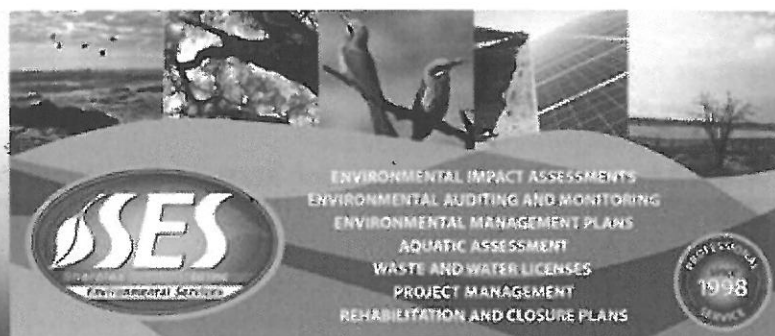
As discussed telephonically last year, attached herewith please find the PPP Plan for the abovementioned S24G process.

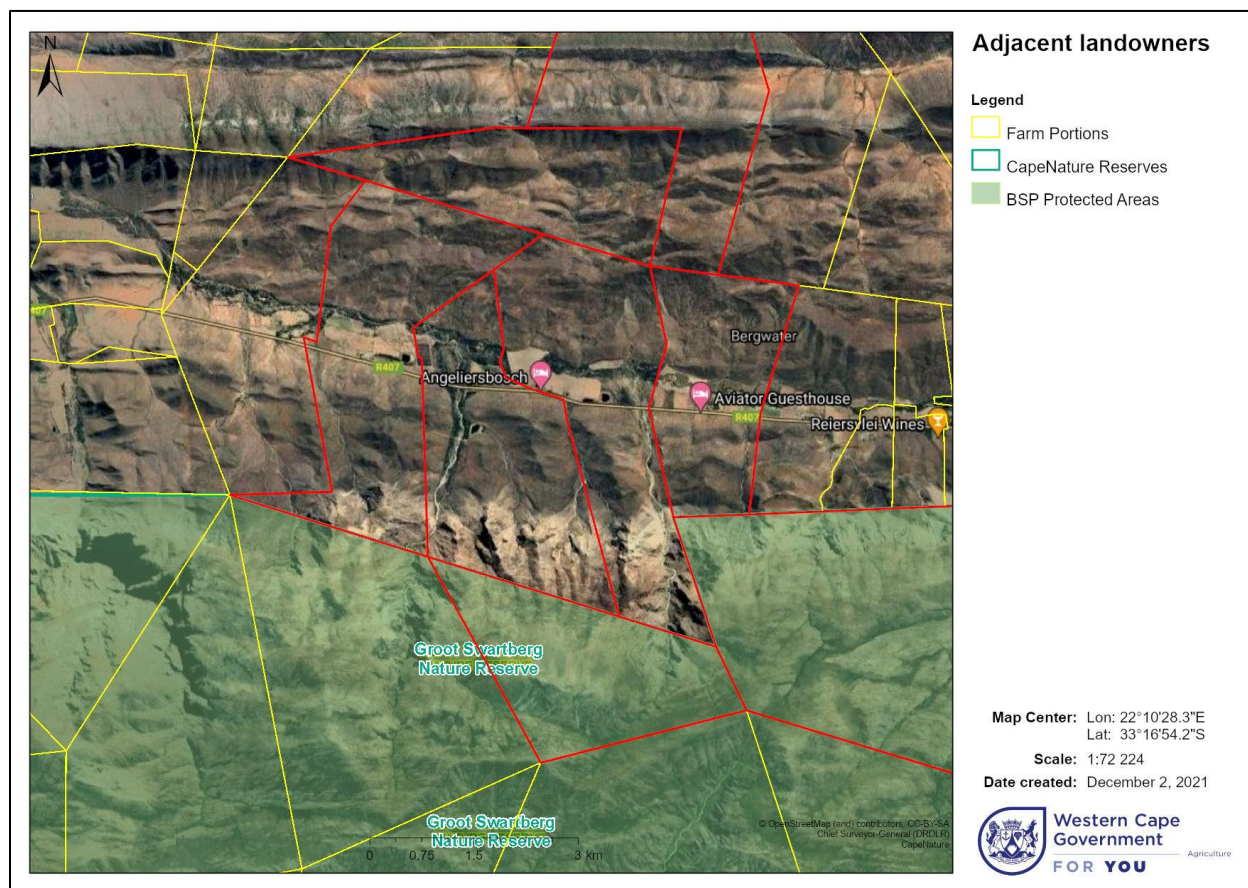


Figure 3: Site locality and cadastral map

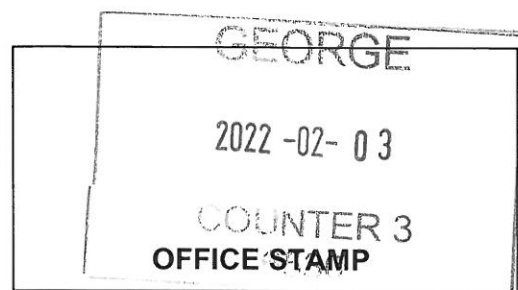

Please note that our comments only pertain to the biodiversity related impacts and not to the overall desirability of the application. CapeNature wishes to make the following comments:</p> <p>According to the Western Cape Biodiversity Spatial Plan (Pool-Stanvliet <i>et.al.</i> 2017) the areas impacted on the farm are classified as Critical Biodiversity Areas (CBA 1: Terrestrial, CBA 1: Aquatic and CBA 2: River) and fragments as Ecological Support Areas (ESA 2: River). The Cordiers River that passes through the farm is a Freshwater Ecosystem Priority Areas (FEPA) river corridor and was affected by the unlawful activity.</p> <p>Mucina and Rutherford 2006 and the WCBSP (Pool-Stanvliet <i>et al.</i> 2017) mapped the vegetation unit as Least Threatened Swartberg Shale Renosterveld. Sometime has already passed since the disturbance therefore if the disturbed areas are not recovering sufficiently then seeds will be sourced to aid recovery of the vegetation. No livestock will be allowed into the recovering areas. A botanical/rehabilitation specialist should conduct 6 monthly audits of the site for 3 years after the authorization.
Suitable monitoring of rehabilitation success is recommended. Long-term monitoring of the vegetation would be more practical to determine whether the mitigation measures are achieving any success, considering the slow recovery in the karoo. CapeNature would require an annual feedback report up to the 3 rd or 4 th year. The report should include the challenges and successes of the rehabilitation. Arid habitats could take years to rehabilitate, even from temporary disturbances therefore possible erosion points need to be monitored and rehabilitated when needed. CapeNature does not consider any habitat as rehabilitated until a comparable level of ecosystem functionality has been proven.			This requirement will be recommended as a condition of retrospective Environmental Authorisation.
In terms of the Alien and Invasive Species regulations, specific alien plant species are either prohibited or listed as requiring a permit; aside from restricted activities concerning, inter alia, their spread, and should be removed. The			The botanical Assessment notes that "Alien plant infestation is also minimal." Having been to site we can confirm alien vegetation is minimal as much of the area is farmed and due to the arid conditions there are no stands of wattle or rooikrans. An
