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1. INTRODUCTION

Sharples Environmental Services cc (SES) has been appointed by Mr Robert More (the applicant) to apply for Environmental Authorisation for the Proposed expansion of the existing Milkwood Manor Guest House and parking on Erf 10190, Remainder of Erf 2066 and Remainder of 706, Plettenberg Bay, Western Cape.

The purpose of this Public Participation Process Plan (PPP) is to get confirmation on the neighbours who must be included as I&APs at the start of the PPP. Since the development will stretch over three properties, a large number of neighbouring properties were identified. RE/706 and RE/2066 are large properties with many adjacent neighbouring properties which will not be affected by the proposed development. It is proposed to only include the neighbours directly adjacent to the proposed developmental site as part of our commitment to going above and beyond the normal Public Participation. It is also proposed to erect 4 English site notices as there is a lot of pedestrians in the area and multiple properties involved. The properties are discussed in more detail in sections 3 and 4.

2. DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED PROJECT

This project proposes to upgrade the existing Milkwood Manor house and expand the existing parking area. It is proposed to expand the ground floor of the Guest House by approx. 550m² and the first floor by approx. 556m² and 8.5m height. It is also proposed to add 32 parking bays to the parking area and construct an ablution block and beach shower deck for public use.

PROJECT SCOPE OF WORK

- Expanding the existing Milkwood Manor house
- Adding 32 parking bays
- Construction of a new ablution block
- Construction of a beach shower deck
- New stone wall and signage
- New deck inside the cadastral boundary of Erf 10190
- Remove existing deck on the rock revetment
- New landscaping
- New bus drop of area




Figure 1: Preferred Layout





Figure 2: Alternative Layout

3. LOCALITIES AND ADJACENT PROPERTIES

As seen from Figure 3, the red polygon indicates the proposed site, and the green areas indicate the properties on which the proposed development will take place. The green areas show Erf 10190, Remainder of 2066 and Remainder of 706. It would make no sense to hand deliver or contact hundreds of residents who border the road and will not be affected by the proposal. It would be a waste of time and money not only to the supplier but also to the residents who would have to try to figure out why they were being contacted. The cost of ElA's is very expensive, and this nonsensical PP would simply drive up the cost further. As such, an alternative means to bring the proposed expansion to the attention of the potential Interested & Affected Parties, the client proposed to have an open day on site. This will further advance our commitment to going above and beyond the normal Public Participation.




Figure 4: Proposed adjacent properties of all sites.

PUBLIC INFORMATION MEETING

Should the need arise for an information sharing session, a virtual meeting will be set up during which the EAP, Engineer, Client and any required specialist will present on the findings of the Impact Assessments. Participants will be given the opportunity to post questions to the presenters, which will be answered in a Q&A session. Any virtual meetings held will be recorded and made available to all registered I&AP's.

7. CONCLUSION

SES confirms that all reasonable measures will be taken to identify potential I&APs for purposes of conducting the public participation on this application.

As far as is reasonably possible all information containing relevant facts in respect of this application will be made available to potential I&APs and participation by potential or registered I&APs will be facilitated in such a manner that all potential or registered I&APs will be provided with a reasonable opportunity to comment.

This public participation plan, once agreed with the competent authority, will be strictly adhered to and any deviations, where relevant, will be identified and submitted to the authority.
